



## **ChangeNOW 2026: Planetary Solutions in a Time of Crisis**

*March 30 - April 1, Grand Palais, Paris*

**Paris - March 18, 2026** - As geopolitical tensions, economic uncertainty, and the overshooting of several planetary boundaries reshape global priorities, accelerating the implementation of solutions for the planet is no longer seen as merely a desirable horizon. It has become a concrete roadmap for action in economic and public debates.

From **March 30 to April 1, 2026**, at the **Grand Palais in Paris**, **ChangeNOW** will bring together an international ecosystem committed to the ecological and social transition to highlight initiatives, innovations, and experiences capable of inspiring new momentum for action.

The 2026 edition is expected to welcome **40,000 participants**, **10,000 committed companies**, **1,200 investors**, **1,000 high-impact solutions**, and representatives from **more than 140 countries**.

#### **The Key Issues at the Heart of the Summit: New Trade-offs in the Ecological and Social Transition**

Over three days, the summit will bring together visions, expertise and projects from around the world to answer the major environmental and societal challenges of our time. Conferences, meetings and discussions will notably address the following key issues:

- Climate change: phasing out fossil fuels, territorial adaptation and developing science and nature-based solutions.
- Global governance: sovereignty, climate and new coalitions.
- Disinformation: restoring trust and protecting our democracies.
- Science and Climate: the power of narratives to mobilize.

Beyond these highlights, ChangeNOW 2026 will bring together other French and international figures from a wide range of backgrounds: political leaders, scientists, entrepreneurs, artists, thinkers and civil society voices. This diversity of perspectives and experiences lies at the heart of the summit's spirit: fostering dialogue between visions, confronting ideas and encouraging encounters capable of sparking new collaborations and inspiring action.

Among these personalities from diverse fields: **Matt Damon** (joining as a virtual speaker), co-founder of Water.org & WaterEquity and award-winning actor and producer; **H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco**; **Christiana Figueres**, former Executive Secretary of the UNFCCC; **Lewis Pugh**, explorer and UNEP Patron of the Oceans; **Luisa Neubauer**, German climate activist; **Elizabeth Wathuti**, Kenyan environmental activist and founder of the Green Generation Initiative; **Julia Faure**, co-founder of Loom and co-president of Mouvement Impact France; **Charles Pépin**, philosopher and author; and **Sébastien Bazin**, CEO of Accor.

## **Innovating Within Planetary Boundaries: Towards Sustainable Ways of Living**

For three days, the Grand Palais will become a global showcase for solutions that present us with a different way to produce, consume and live within the limits of what our planet can realistically provide.

An international selection of companies from more than 90 countries will represent key sectors such as energy, the circular economy, sustainable mobility, agriculture and biodiversity. In total, **460 impact-driven companies and organizations** will present their solutions.

In addition, **160 of them will pitch their projects** to an audience of investors and decision-makers. From early-stage prototypes to fast-growing companies, these innovators will present technologies and business models that are already operational and seeking large-scale deployment.

Among the solutions showcased: **Sun-Ways** (solar panels installed between railway tracks), **Kikleio** (an intelligent camera that measures food waste in restaurants), **Sparxell** (plant-based pigments designed to replace polluting dyes), **Enerdrape** (geothermal panels that capture heat from parking structures and tunnels to heat or cool buildings), **Cyclize** (a process that converts industrial waste and CO<sub>2</sub> into gas for industry), **Genomines** (a technology that grows plants capable of absorbing critical metals to recover them with reduced mining impact), and **Baeru Environmental Services** (a system combining sensors and AI to monitor and recover plastic waste along coastlines).

Visitors will also be able to discover and test the **autonomous waste-sorting robots developed by Antfarm**, the **next-generation bike taxis created by Turtle**, and the **3D-printed coral reef regeneration solutions developed by rreefs**.

Beyond the conferences and solutions showcased at the Grand Palais, ChangeNOW 2026 will also deploy several programs designed to strengthen key ecosystems of the transition. **Women for Change** will highlight women leading ecological and social transformations. **Africa for Change** will bring together entrepreneurs, investors and decision-makers around solutions emerging across the African continent. **Banlieues for Change** will bring together young people from the French 'banlieues' who are seeking to drive positive change for their communities and for the planet'.

## **Rethinking the Economy and Finance in the Face of Planetary Boundaries**


**10,000 companies and 1,200 investors** will gather at the Grand Palais, making ChangeNOW one of the largest convenings of economic actors committed to the ecological transition. The shift toward sustainable economic models is accelerating worldwide, driven in particular by impact startups and a growing ecosystem of specialized investors. At ChangeNOW, entrepreneurs, investment funds and major corporations will come together to identify the financing, partnerships and collaborations needed to scale impactful solutions.


Reflecting the rapid growth of impact finance, **105 funds have applied to the Funds for Change program**, representing more than **\$10.9 billion in fundraising ambitions**. This momentum will be notably represented at ChangeNOW by **Isabelle Combarel**, President of the Executive Board at Arkéa Capital; **Eva Gladek**, Founder and CEO of Metabolic; and **Amara Goeree**, Sustainability Director, Private Equity at Schrodgers Capital.

Leaders from companies such as **Kering, AXA, L'Oréal, Bouygues, KPMG, Saint-Gobain, Salesforce** and **Schneider Electric** will share their strategies and best practices for reducing environmental impact. Discussions will focus on integrating planetary boundaries into economic and financial models, mitigation and adaptation strategies, multi-stakeholder collaboration, and value chain engagement.
